THE FORT LOUDOUN STORY

Fort Loudoun was the western most British fortification during the French and Indian War (1754-1763). It was constructed by the Independent Company of South Carolina in 1756 due to threats of French activities in the Mississippi Valley. This move helped ally the British and the Overhill Cherokee Nation in the fight against the French and guaranteed that trade would continue between the Cherokee and South Carolina.

Over the course of the Fort's four-year existence relations between South Carolina and the Cherokee Nation broke down. In August 1760, the Cherokee laid siege on Fort Loudoun and its garrison. After the garrison surrendered in 1760, Fort Loudoun was never used again for any military


