
Purpose


children received a CASA advocate to represent them in the court system last year.







New Bills in Effect

- SB2570: As enacted, authorizes a person who suffers loss or injury as a result of a defendant intentionally obstructing a
 highway, street, or other place used for the passage of vehicles or conveyances to bring a cause of action against such
 person to recover compensatory damages from the loss or injury.
- HB0623 Effective date(s) 07/01/2024 Amends TCA Title 56 and Title 66. As enacted, specifies that a seller of residential property is required to disclose the presence of a known sinkhole on the property prior to entering into a contract with a buyer regardless of whether the sinkhole
- HB1814 Effective date(s) 01/01/2025 Amends TCA Title 66. As enacted, requires a landlord, or a person authorized to enter into a rental agreement on the landlord's behalf, to disclose to the tenant in writing at or before the commencement of the tenancy certain contact information for the acceptance of service of process, receipt of notices and demands, maintenance services, and landlord tenant com
- HB2286 628 Effective date(s) 07/01/2024 Amends TCA Title 65, Chapter 31. As enacted, makes revisions to the Underground Utility Damage Prevention Act, such as amending requirements for emergency excavations and the imposition of civil penalties.
- SB0589 428 Effective date(s) 01/01/2024 Amends TCA Section 55-8-199. As enacted, enacts the "Eddie Conrad Act,"
 which establishes the number of points to be charged to a person's driving record for violations of driving while using a wireless telecommunications device

Community Information

New Bills in Effect

- SB2150
- AMENDMENT #1 rewrites the bill to add to the law regarding homeowners' associations, as follows:
 - (1) This amendment requires a homeowners' association seeking to levy a special assessment on its members for a nonessential amenity to (i) pass the assessment by at least a two-thirds majority vote of the total members in the homeowners' association; and (ii) provide members with financing or a payment plan over a defined period of time. As used in this amendment, a "nonessential amenity" means an amenity that is not essential to the daily regular operation of the community, including a pool, tennis court, or club house and does not include: (i) a road, utility, or other amenity that is necessary to the daily regular operation of a community; or (ii) an amenity described in the declaration but not yet built;
- (2) This amendment provides that if a member of the homeowners' association fails to pay a special assessment for a nonessential amenity, then this amendment prohibits the homeowners' association from taking a foreclosure action against the property or the member for failure to pay the special assessment; and
- (3) This amendment revises the present law that provides that the law regarding multiple ownership of property relevant to homeowners' associations applies to declaration amendments that are enacted on or after May 1, 2021. This amendment clarifies that such present law is not applicable to the provisions in this amendment.

New Bills in Effect

- SB0863 205 Effective date(s) 01/01/2024 Amends TCA Title 66, Chapter 27. As enacted, requires a board of directors for a unit owners' association to either update a reserve study or conduct a reserve study if certain conditions are met.
- SB1131 522 Effective date(s) 03/01/2024 Amends TCA Section 55-8-185. As enacted, removes the limitation that ATVs and off-highway vehicles may be operated on a certain segment of State Route 62 and State Route 330 within the Town of Oliver Springs in Anderson County only two weekends per year. (Wind Rock ATV Park)
- SB1917 806 Effective date(s) 04/29/2024 Amends TCA Title 36, Chapter 3. As enacted, prohibits marriage between first cousins.


